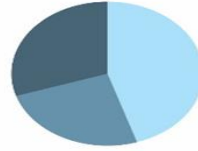

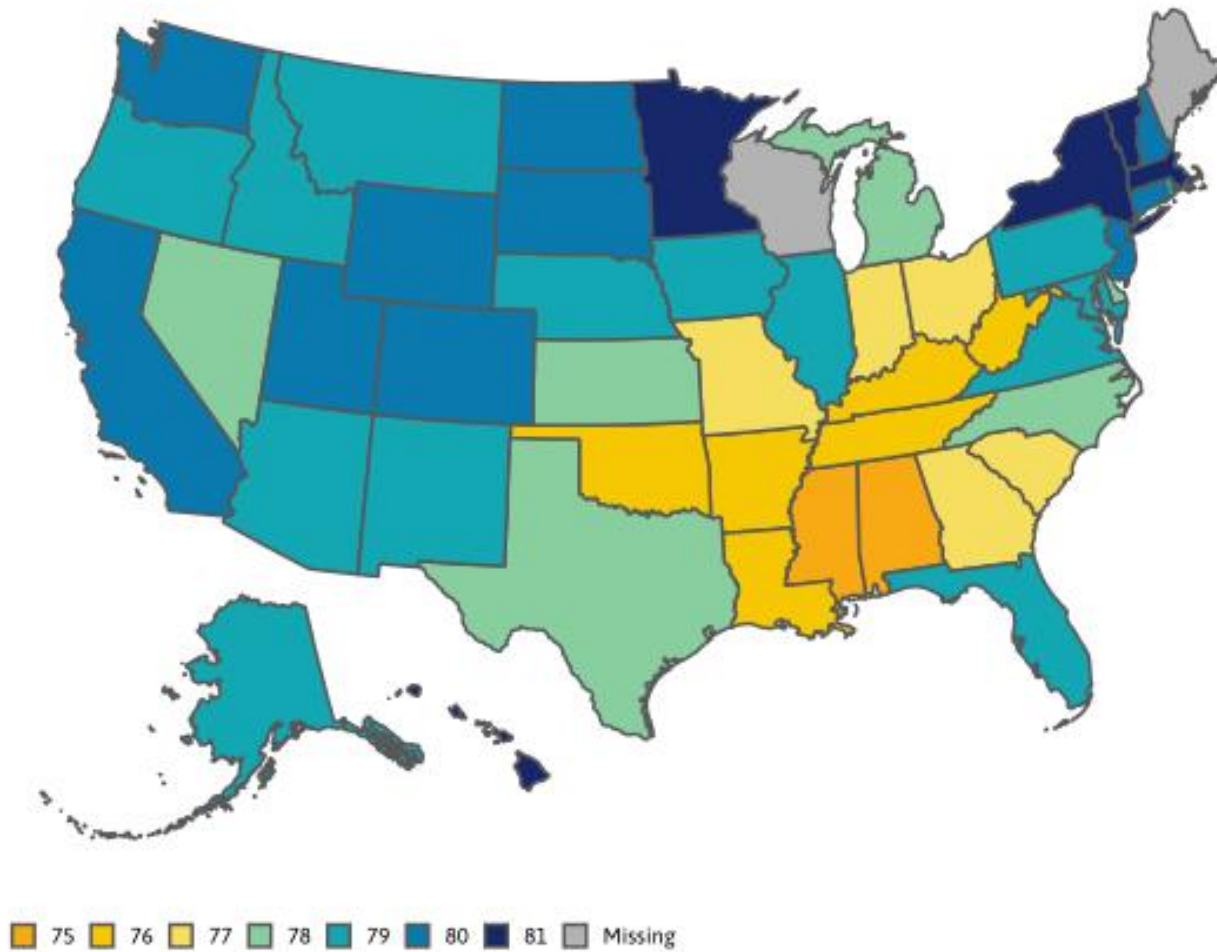

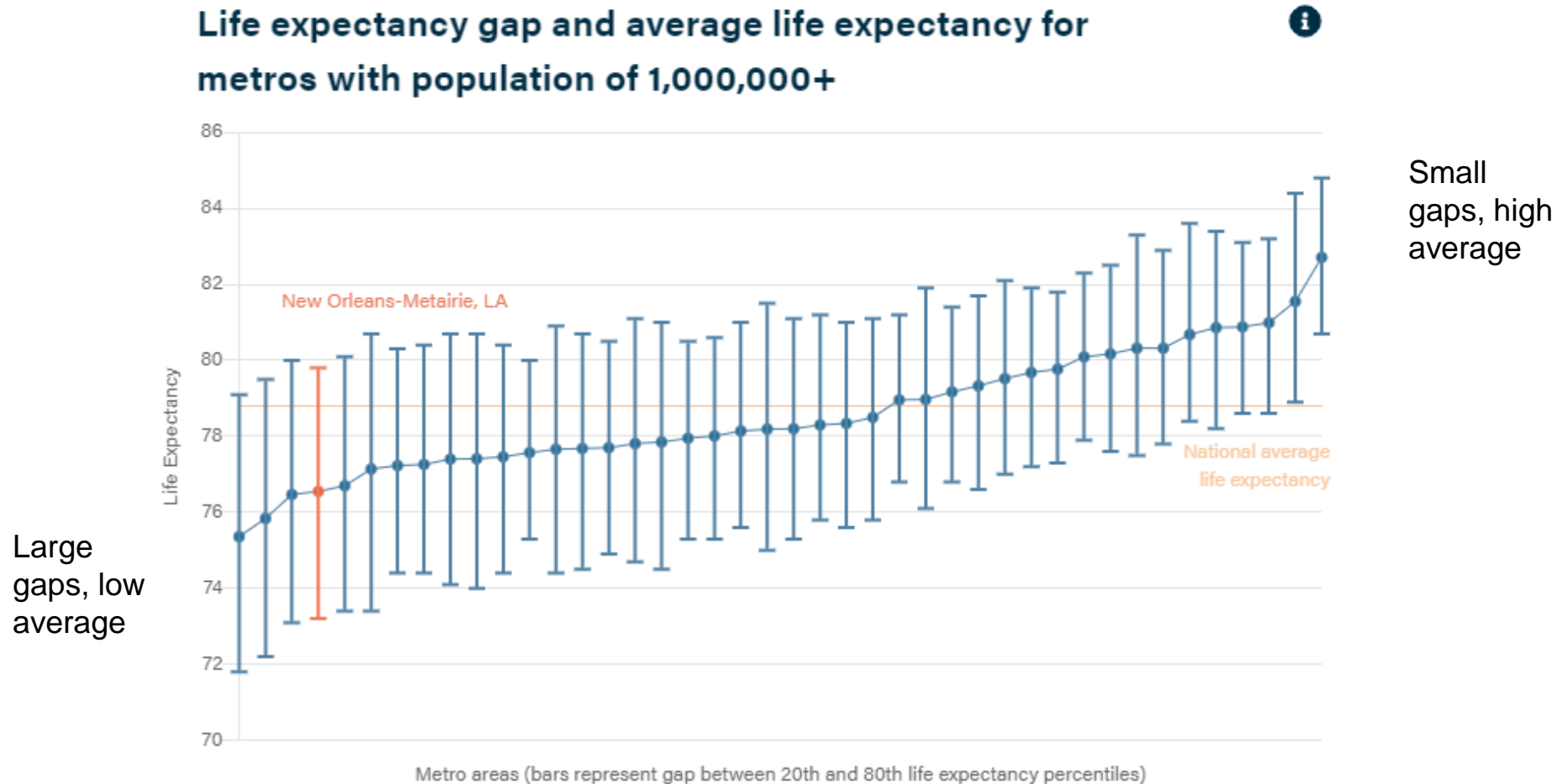

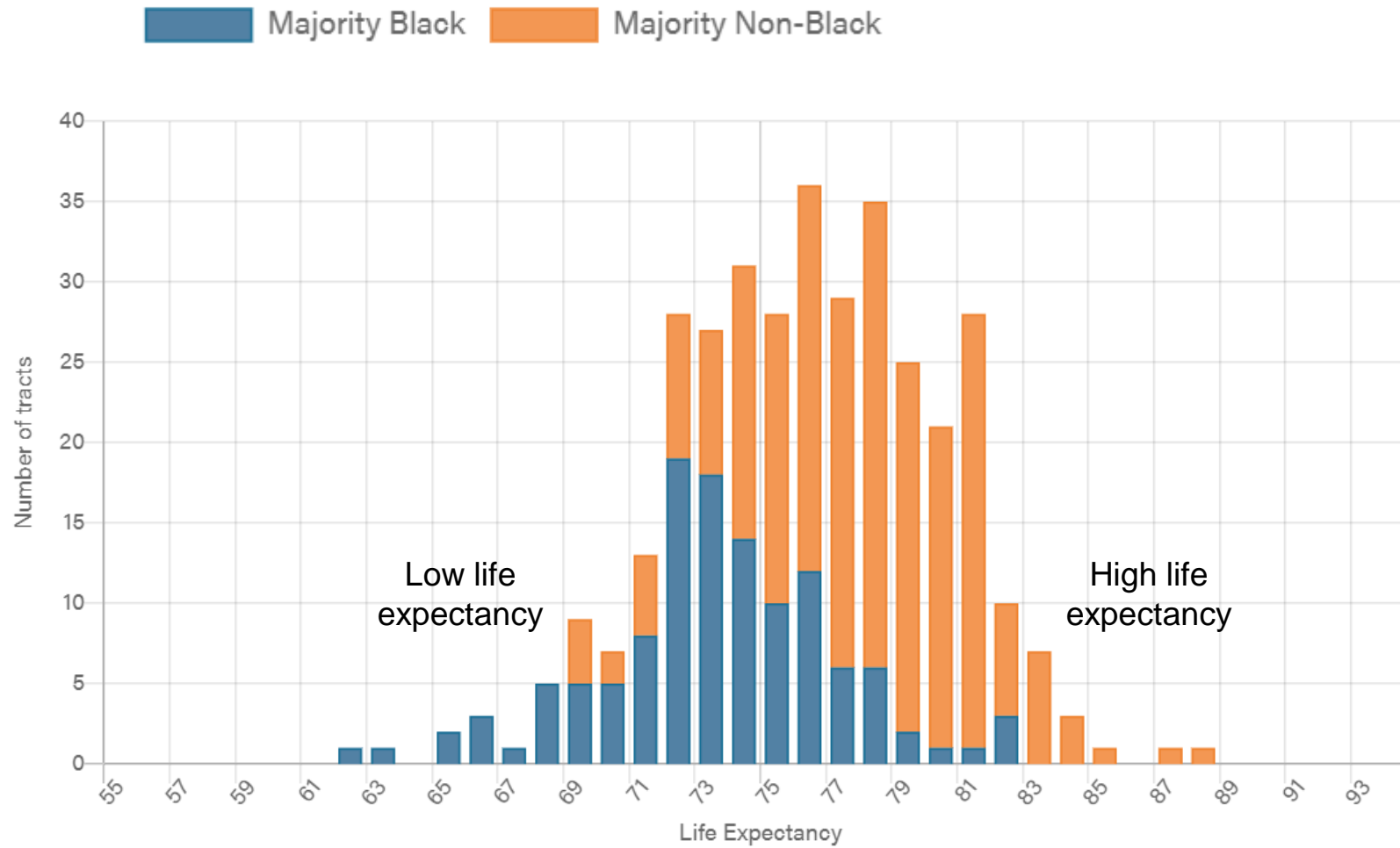
Different regions of the country have different levels of life expectancy.



Urban regions with longer *average* life expectancy have smaller gaps.

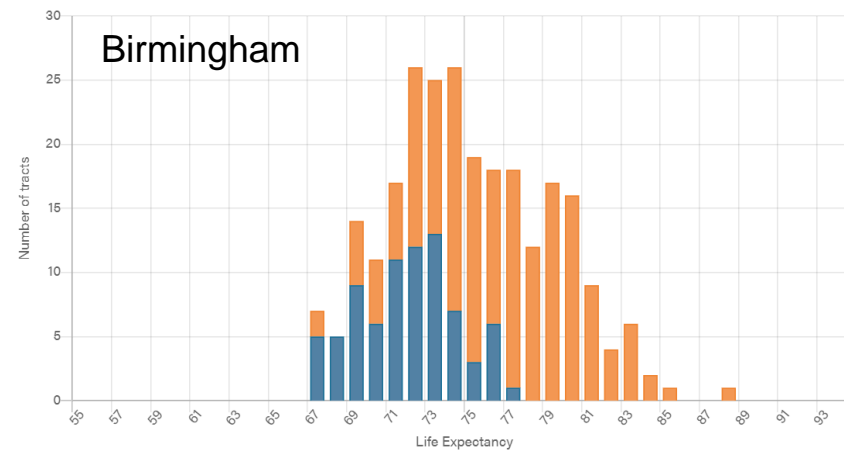
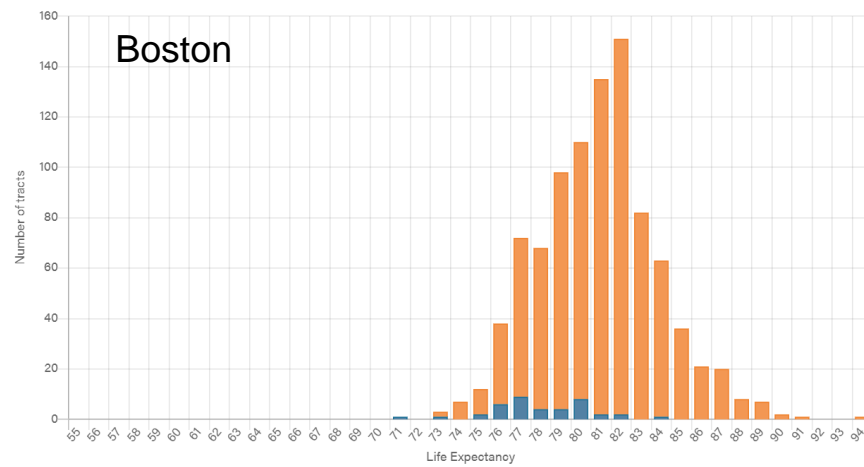
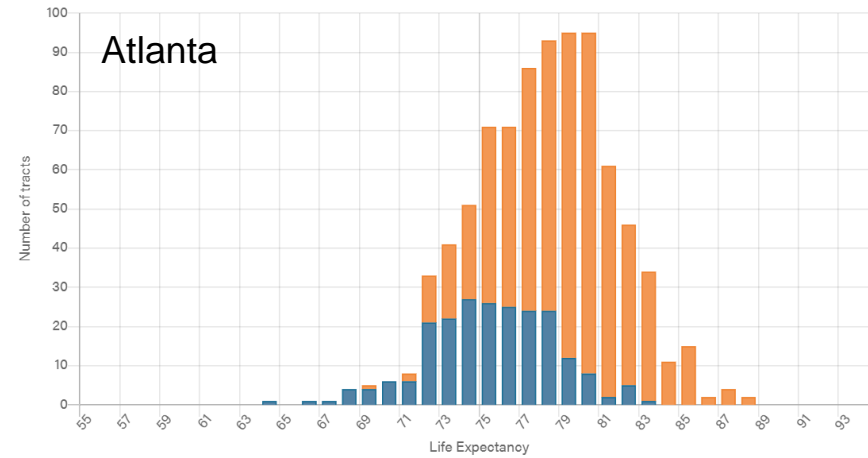
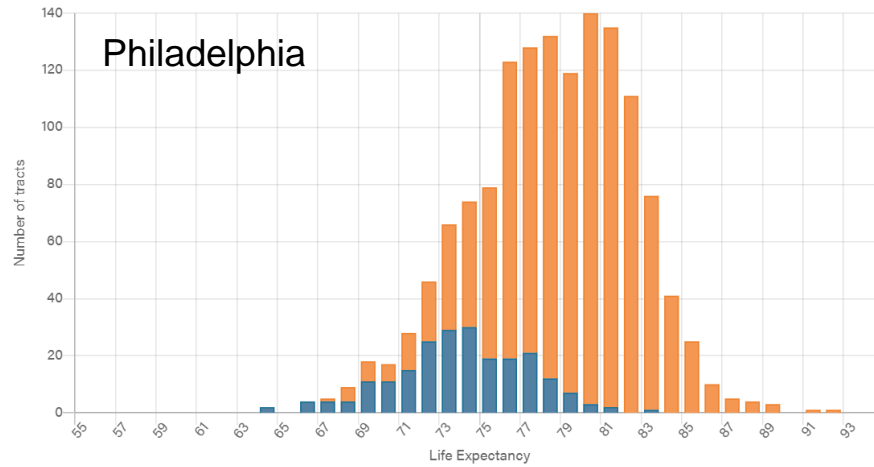


Life expectancy in white and black neighborhoods have different distributions in New Orleans...



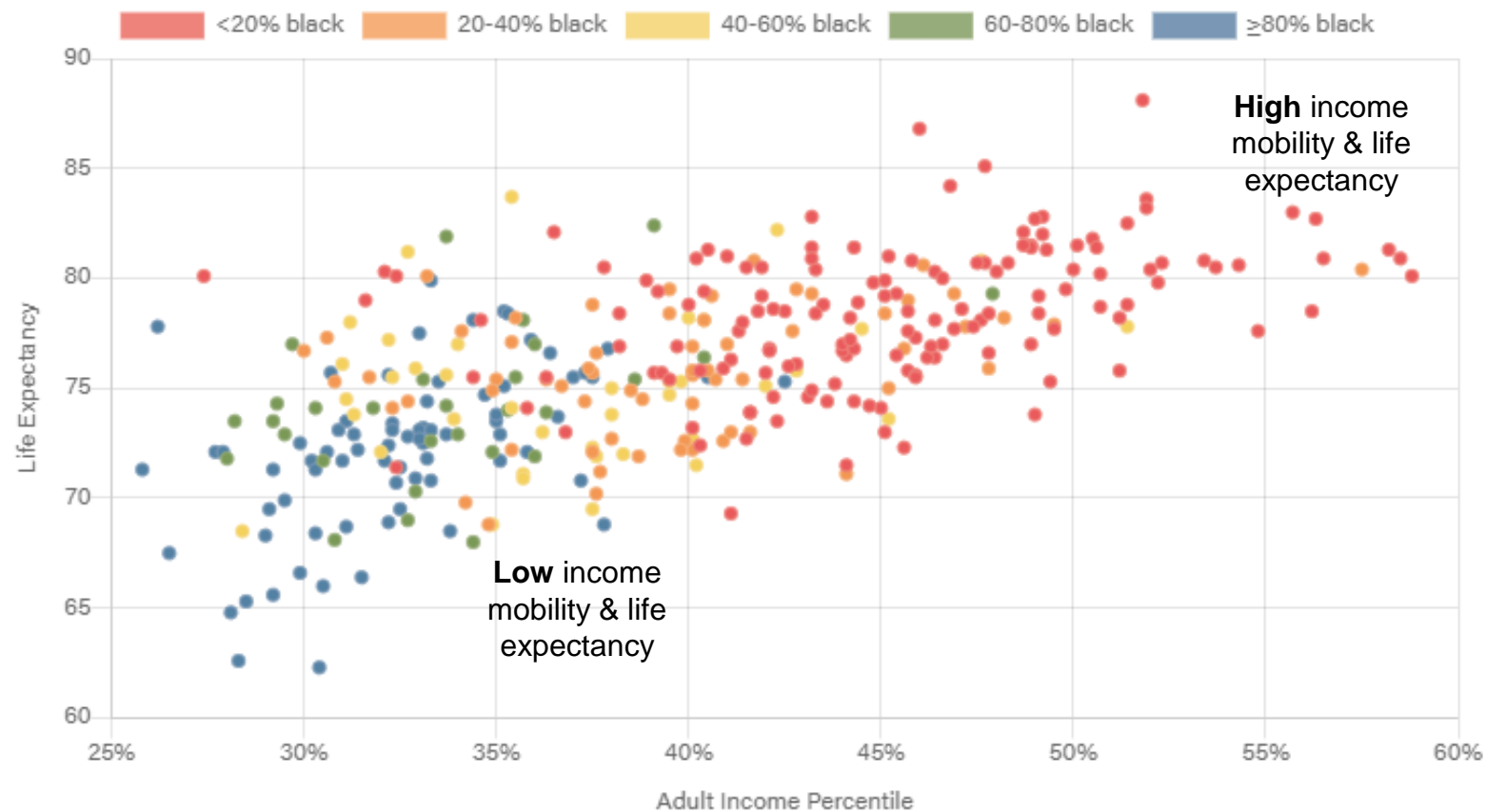
... and this pattern is not unique.
